This endeavor represents a partial listing of the ancestors, descendants, and other relatives of my great grandfather, Carl Gustav Reinhold Gall (1862-1940), who was born in Silesia and immigrated to the USA in 1881 from Pomerania, a province of Germany on the Baltic Sea that was part of Prussia at that time. His three brothers and younger half sister also immigrated to Michigan: Hermann in 1880; Wilhelm and Ottilie in June 1883; and Robert in 1884.

My great grandfather settled in Sebewaing (Huron County), Michigan, where he owned a farm and raised a large family.

I am grateful to many people for their assistance with my research of the Gall family. We all walk in the footsteps of others who were curious enough to ask questions and diligently record the answers. This family history could not have been prepared without the earlier work of many aunts, uncles and cousins.

This charming gentleman motivated my initial research of our Gall relatives in 1967 when he helped me transcribe the church documents about our ancestors that he obtained at the Evangelical Rectory Office (Pfarramt) in Altöl in 1937. A Brief History of Pomerania

Pomerania (or "Pommern" - the German name) was a Prussian province in northern Germany on the Baltic Sea, bordered by West Prussia to the east, Brandenburg to the south, and Mecklenburg-Schwerin to the west. The Oder River divided Pomerania into two parts, Vorpommern, the area west of the Oder, and Hinterpommern, the area to the east. Stettin, a port city on the Oder, was the capital of Pomerania.

The Pomeranian landscape is relatively flat with rolling hills interspersed with forests and lakes. The woods include many types of trees, including beech, oak, birch, and pine trees. Black storks, cormorants, swans, and grey herons are plentiful in the lakes and marshes. In the 1800s, the most commonly grown crops were rye, wheat, oats, barley, sugar beets, and potatoes.

Germanic tribes that migrated from Scandinavia before 100 B.C. were the earliest inhabitants of Pomerania. After these tribes migrated westward by 600 A.D., the area was settled by Slavic tribes that entered from the east and settled in the areas that became Pomerania and Poland. Pomerania became part of the Holy Roman Empire in 1181, beginning a dynasty that continued for four centuries.

In the 12th and 13th centuries, immigrants from Westfalen, Niedersachsen, Holstein, Mecklenburg, and the Rhineland colonized Pomerania, establishing German villages and introducing trade to the region. The Pomeranian dukes welcomed these skilled immigrants, who cleared the forests, constructed dikes and roads, drained marshes, and farmed the land. The German language and culture ultimately dominated the area.

The Church was instrumental in the early colonization of Pomerania. Pomerania was significantly impacted by the Reformation. Antagonism between the Catholics and the Protestants continued after the establishment of the Lutheran Church of Pomerania in the 1530s. In 1618, the Thirty Years War began primarily as a civil war between members of the two religions. Sweden entered the war in the summer of 1630. King Gustavus Adolphus, a Protestant, was concerned about the growing power of the Roman Emperor Ferdinand. The war took a heavy toll in Pommern, causing the destruction of many farms and villages and killing as many as one-third of its people. When the war ended in 1648, Sweden was awarded control over Stettin and Vorpommern as compensation for its role. The Brandenburg Electors retained control of Hinterpommern.

In the early 1700s, Pomerania was the battleground for conflicts between Russia and Sweden. The Treaty of Stockholm (1720) ceded part of Pomerania to Brandenburg-Prussia. After Napoleon was defeated, the remaining part of Swedish Pomerania was given to Prussia in 1815.

Prussia was a powerful military nation that occupied the northern two thirds of Germany when King Wilhelm I became the first emperor of the German Empire in 1871. In 1945, after World War II, Prussia ceased to exist as a German state and Pomerania was partitioned again at the Oder River. Hinterpommern and Stettin (renamed Szczecin) became part of Poland. The Germans fled or were expelled from their country. Vorpommern became part of the reunified Germany in 1990, and was subsequently included in the state of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

Life in Pomerania in Past Centuries

Beginning in the 15th century, the peasants progressively began to lose their rights. Many were evicted from their land and forced to provide labor, horses and tools to the landlords. The institution of serfdom was imposed in the16th century. In the 18th century, the life of the general population in Pomerania was subject to the dictates of the noble lords and ruling class. Most of the land was controlled by the landed gentry of Prussia's eastern provinces, who exercised absolute power and dominated state and society. Many large estates were ultimately subdivided into smaller estates through inheritance and partitioning.

Basic housing, a few animals, small garden plots, and a share of the fields were provided to peasants in return for their labor. Conditions in Hinterpommern began to slowly improve in the mid-18th century. Friedrich the Great, who ruled from 1740 to 1786, reduced the labor obligation of the peasants and allowed

them to voice complaints against the landlords. Education was made mandatory for all children between the ages of 5 and 14. Friedrich also offered special privileges to the settlers and introduced new methods of land distribution. Unfortunately, he was succeeded in 1786 by his nephew, Friedrich Wilhelm II, who opposed the agrarian reforms and allowed the nobility to seize much of the peasants' land. By the beginning of the 18th century, the commoners owned less than 10% of the land.

The peasants fared better under the leadership of his son, Friedrich Wilhelm III, who became King in 1797. In addition to agrarian reforms that were instituted between 1808 and 1816 that provided increased freedom to the peasants, the institution of serfdom was abolished in Pomerania in 1811. The serfs were now free to move from village to village, choose their own trade, and marry a spouse of their choice. Tenants were responsible for rent or labor services to the estates. To become free owners of their land, they had to surrender part of the land to their masters - one-third in the case of hereditary holdings and one-half if they had no hereditary rights to the land. Many peasants were unable to survive after relinquishing their land and often were forced to sell the remaining land or become day laborers.

The inhabitants of the rural countryside lived in small villages often located around the landed estates, which generally consisted of a large manor house, several huge barns and stables, and perhaps a flour mill or distillery. The social activities in the small villages centered on family, church, and the community. Most villagers remained close to their villages. Houses were generally constructed of posts and beams plastered with a mixture of clay and straw. Roofs were thatched and floors were packed clay. The house and barn were usually connected.

Farmers encountered the usual problems of bad weather, crop failures, and falling commodity prices. In 1825, extensive crop failures caused such marked drops in land values that even manor houses on the estates were put up for sale. A potato blight in 1845, which caused widespread famine, was followed by disastrous weather conditions in the mid 1850s. Precipitous declines in grain prices in the 1880s-caused by imports of cheap cereals from America and Russia-and an accompanying drop in wool prices severely reduced the already low farm revenue, leading to a situation of economic crisis in Pomerania.

Emigration from Pomerania

Many people, especially those from the lower social classes, had limited prospects for the future after the change from feudal to civil-capitalist rule disrupted their lives. The elimination of the institution of serfdom negatively impacted the lives of many people, actually worsening the conditions for most peasants because the estate owners were freed of the obligations that existed under feudal law to provide their tenants with a way to support themselves.

Many landowners took advantage of the elimination of serfdom to discharge their laborers, who were now considered legally free, and manage their estates with a minimum of permanent workers. Many landowners did not want to have to provide care for injured or older laborers. It was very difficult for day-laborers to find permanent work elsewhere because they needed to receive the right of establishment (which could be difficult to obtain) from a new employer.

Laborers were often forced to travel the countryside, moving from estate to estate to provide their labor for clearing and planting fields or harvesting crops to the estate owners. Persons who had not been granted the right of establishment could not marry, establish a home, or have a family. Paid laborers who were refused the right of establishment by the ruling class for their entire lives were given only a limited right to residence for as long as they had work. These inhumane conditions led to a surge in emigration from Pomerania.

Although freedom of worship was decreed in Prussia in 1740, Friedrich Wilhelm III ordered the merger of the Lutheran Church and the Calvinist Reformed Church in 1817. Many devout Lutherans objected and formed their own churches. Many "Old Lutherans" chose to leave their homeland rather than comply, causing a chain migration to other countries, including North America.

Observers who had been sent to the United States by the "Old Lutherans" to locate areas with conditions most similar to the Baltic lands concluded that these areas were Buffalo, New York, and Milwaukee, Wisconsin, largely because they had the same glacial geography that existed in the Baltic areas of Prussia. Myron Gruenwald (1994) described this chain migration:

In November of 1838, the first five ships left Prussia. The people landed at New York harbor, then took the Erie Canal up to Buffalo. In 1839 another flotilla of 5 ships arrived at Buffalo, but this time some 40 families chose not to remain there but moved on through the Great Lakes to Milwaukee. They set up a colony called Freistadt - just to the north. A third flotilla arrived in 1843. For the first years, up to about 1855, the greatest amount of migration was from the push for these religious reasons.

By that time the economic conditions (and their great difference reported by friends, family, and neighbors in America) represented both a push from the Baltic and a mighty pull from America and elsewhere. The migration pattern actually formed a chain that can be followed by their settlement patterns today. This was from Buffalo, jumping on to Milwaukee, and spreading out first through the state of Wisconsin.

Faced with such difficult circumstances in practically every aspect of their daily lives, it is not surprising that many of the inhabitants of Pomerania in the 19th century decided to emigrate to North America, where they could take advantage of the opportunities that life there might offer, including the possibility of owning their own land and providing increased economic and educational possibilities for themselves and their families.

What had begun as a massive emigration of "Old Lutherans" around 1840 continued into the 1880s, as an emigration of Pomeranians who left their homeland for economic and social reasons. Because the preferred route for a large number of these immigrants was to travel to Wiscons in by steamship through the Great Lakes, many settled in Canada and on the eastern bank of Lake Michigan or the Chicago area. As the Pomeranian immigrants continued to arrive-and the best land and forests became occupied by these immigrants-successive waves of immigrants settled further west, including in such states as Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Illinois, Nebraska, South Dakota, and North Dakota.

The Gall Brothers Emigrate from their Homeland

Why did Gustav Gall, his brothers - Wilhelm, Herman, and Robert - and their half sister Ottilie immigrate to America?

Baldur Schütt and Donald Gall, two of their grand-nephews (one German and one American) discussed this issue in 1992 when Donald and his wife Erika visited Baldur and his family in Klein Rönnau, Germany. Donald summarized their conversation as follows:

At the time that our grandfathers left Germany, the land must have been divided so many times between sons of each generation that going to America was tempting to young men so they could improve their lot! Baldur agreed that this could have been a contributing factor, as evidenced by statements that his father Hugo Schütt had made about their early Gall ancestors and relatives.

It is interesting to note that Baldur's father, Hugo Schütt, corresponded with Charles and Eric Gall, the sons of Hugo's cousin Hermann (Hermann) Gall, in the 1940s and 1950s. Eric Gall (1893-1961) was the father of Donald Gall.

In a letter that Hugo wrote to Eric from Eilsdorf, Germany in 1950, he described their flight from Pomerania to the western part of Germany after World War II (See subsequent translation of this letter in the section titled "Hugo Schütt's Letter to Eric Gall in Michigan (1950)"; and refer to the appendix for the original German transcription of this letter).

We may never know for certain why the Gall brothers left Pomerania for an uncertain future in a land far away. However, we do know that the brothers and their younger sister Ottilie settled in Michigan, where they raised families and remained in contact with their relatives who remained in Germany.

Karl Heinrich Gall-Galle and Maria Rosina Kunisch

The parents of Hermann, Gustav, Robert, and Wilhelm Gall were Karl Heinrich Gall-Galle and Maria Rosina Kunisch.

Karl Heinrich Gall was born January 2, 1822 in Nieder Thomaswaldau, Kreis Bunzlau, Silesia (Schlesien), Prussia; died February 7, 1882 in Kölpin, Kreis Usedom, Pomerania, Prussia. He was the son of Gottlieb Galle and Johanna Henriette Christiana Jaursch.

He married Maria Rosina Kunisch on February 5, 1850 at the Evangelical Church (Evangelische Kirche) in Kaiserswaldau, Kreis Bunzlau, Silesia, Prussia. Maria Rosina was born August 5, 1827 in Silesia, Prussia, and died on May 11, 1869 in Groß-Mokratz, Kreis Usedom, Pomerania, Prussia. She was the daughter of Johann Gottlieb Kunisch and Johanna Eleonora Stamsin.

Their baptismal records, marriage certificate, and Karl Heinrich's death certificate appear below.



Marie Schreiber and Bernhard Schütt

Marie Elisabeth Helene Schreiber was born on January 7, 1878. She was the only child of Pauline Henriette Ernestine (Gall) and Karl Friedrich Ferdinand Schreiber, who was listed as a "Statthalter" (an antiquated term for a type of government official, e.g., "governor" or "viceroy" on her birth record.

She met and married Bernhard E. Johannes Schütt. They married around the turn of the century, and raised a large family on the island of Wollin on the Baltic Sea in Silesia (Pomerania).

Marie and Bernhard had five children. Their oldest child, Hugo Carl August Schütt, was born on March 29, 1903 in Dargebanz, Kreis Usedom on Wollin. They also had four daughters, Dora, Ella, Greta, and Irma.

Hugo Carl August Schütt

Hugo Carl August Schütt was born on March 29, 1903 in Dargebanz, Kreis Usedom on Wollin. He was the son of Marie Elisabeth Helene Schreiber and Bernhard Schütt. He had four younger sisters, Dora, Ella, Greta, and Irma.

Hugo was an industrious young man who was an agricultural inspector for large farms and estates in the region where he lived in Pommern, and subsequently in 1939 became the department director of the agricultural association in Stettin He married Hildegard Ida Maria Wallow. They had two children, Baldur Schütt, born in Naugard, a small town northeast of Stettin, on August 23, 1939, and Karin Ida Marie Schütt, who was born on November 27, 1942 in Neustettin.

The family faced upheaval in 1945 when they were forced to flee their homeland, leaving their beloved family members and most of their possessions behind. Germany lay in ruins when it surrendered unconditionally on May 8, 1945 after World War II ended in Europe. Grief and uncertainty about the future made life in occupied Germany difficult. The German population was expelled from East Prussia and the areas east of the Oder and Neisse Rivers after the Soviets annexed these territories. Most people could only take a few belongings on their forced departures from their homeland. The arrival of the many refugees in the western part of Germany compounded the devastating shortages of food, housing, fuel, and medical supplies. Germany - without an official government - was divided into four zones by the victorious allies, the United States, the Soviet Union, Britain, and France.

In a letter he wrote to Eric Gall in Michigan on March 27, 1950, Hugo described the extremely difficult situation his family faced as they fled from Wollin in 1945. Eric was the son of Hugo's cousin Herman Gall, who was the brother of Hugo's grandmother Pauline Gall Schreiber. Herman emigrated from Pomerania in 1881. The "Charly and Meta" (Gall), to whom Hugo referred in his letter, were Herman's son Charles Gall and his wife Meta (this letter appears in its entirety in German and English in the next section):

As refugees, we live here rather meagerly. We have lost all of our possessions. We receive minimal support and live with a farmer here in one room, in which we sleep and cook. We have here in West Germany more than two million people out of work. There is no work (or earnings) available. Charly and Meta have helped us a lot, especially earlier when we had hardly anything to wear.

Thirteen million refugees currently live in the British and American zones. The Polish people continue to force the Germans to leave, although they cannot be supported here in Germany. I hope that you can still read my handwriting.

The family lived in Eilsdorf in the British zone, and eventually settled in Pronstorf, a small village in the province of Schleswig Holstein in northern Germany. Most of the land in this village was owned by the Evangelical Church and by the local nobility (a "Graf" - count or earl - continues to live there).

Hugo had very few resources, but managed to buy some land from the church, and, with the assistance and hard work of his wife and children, built a thriving Gasthaus and restaurant that they called the Pronstorfer Krug. His daughter Karin and her husband Jürgen Leonhard continue to run the Pronstorfer Krug. Karin and Jürgen have enlarged and transformed the Pronstorfer Krug into a large hotel and convention center that attracts guests from all over Germany and other countries.

Hugo died on October 31, 1981, in Pronstorf, at the age of 78 years.

It is a German tradition to send a death notice to friends and relatives when someone in a family dies. Hugo's family notified others of his death with the following notice:

Baldur Schütt und his wife Ingrid, nee Klopfenstein with Birgit, and all of his relatives - Pronstorf, October 31, 1981. The funeral will take place on Friday, November 6, 1981 at 2 PM at the church in Pronstorf.

Hugo's wife Hildegard died on January 29, 1983.

Hugo Schütt's Letter to Eric Gall in Michigan (1950)

Hugo Schütt described the extremely difficult circumstances that his family - Hugo, his wife Hildegard, and their young children, Baldur and Karin - faced as they fled from Wollin after the end of World War II, in a letter he wrote on March 27, 1950 to Eric Gall in Michigan. Eric was the son of Hugo's first cousin (once removed) Herman Gall, the brother of Hugo's grandmother Pauline Gall Schreiber (Herman emigrated from Pomerania in 1881):

Eilsdorf, March 27, 1950 Kreis Segeberg/Holstein, Germany

Dear Eric.

You will be amazed to get a letter from Germany. Your brother Charles gave me your address and I don't want to miss the opportunity to write you a few lines. My grandmother Ernestine Schreiber, born Gall, is the sister of Uncle Hermann and Uncle Gustav. My mother Marie Schütt is the only daughter of my grandmother Ernestine Schreiber. My grandmother died in 1923. Your father, Uncle Hermann, visited us in 1912 in Dargebanz, on Wollin (island) in Pomerania. My mother Marie Schütt, born Schreiber, is 72 years old. My father, Bernhard Schütt, is 80 years old. They live with my sister Dora. I have four sisters-Ella, Greta, Dora, and Irma. They are all married to farmers and live in Pomerania in the Russian zone. I live in Eilsdorf in the British zone and I had to flee from the Russians in 1945 with my two-year-old daughter Karin and son Baldur. I was the department director of the agricultural association in Stettin, Pomerania. Before 1939, I was the agricultural inspector for the larger farms/estates.

As Charly told me, your wife died years ago and you have five children.

Is Amanda Gall, the daughter of Uncle Gustav, married? What is her name now and where does she live? Are your children grown? Your wife was a teacher, wasn't she?

As refugees, we live here rather meagerly. We have lost all of our possessions. We receive minimal support and live with a farmer here in one room, in which we sleep and cook. We have here in West Germany more than two million people out of work. There is no work (or earnings) available. Charly and Meta have helped us a lot, especially earlier when we had hardly anything to wear.

Thirteen million refugees currently live in the British and American zones. The Polish people continue to force the Germans to leave, although they cannot be supported here in Germany. I hope that you can still read my handwriting.

I am enclosing a photo of my family. Charly sent us a photo of Uncle Hermann. Perhaps you can send us some photos of you and your family. You can write me in English. We would be so happy to hear from you.

Meine Großmutter Ernestine Schreiber, geborene Gall, ist die Schwester von Onkel Hermann und Onkel Gustav. Meine Mutter Marie Schütt ist die einzige Tochter von meiner Großmutter Ernestine Schreiber. 1923 ist meine Großmutter gestorben. 1912 hat Dein Vater also Onkel Hermann uns in Dargebanz, Insel Wollin in Pommern noch besucht. Meine Mutter Marie Schütt, geb. Schreiber ist 72 Jahre alt. Mein Vater Bernhard Schütt ist 80 Jahre alt. Sie leben bei meiner Schwester Dora. Ich habe 4 Schwestern, Ella, Greta, Dora u Irma. Sie sind alle mit Bauern verheiratet und leben in Pommern in der russichen Zone. Ich lebe in Eilsdorf in der brit. Zone und ich musste 1945 mit meiner Frau und meiner 2 jährigen Tochter Karin und dem Sohn Baldur vor den Russen fliehen. Ich war Abteilungsleiter bei der Landesbauernschaft in Stettin Pommern. Vor 1939 war ich landwirtschaftlicher Inspector auf größeren Gütern.

Wie Charly mir mitteilte ist Deine liebe Frau vor Jahren gestorben und Du hast 5 Kinder.

Ist Amanda Gall die Tochter von Onkel Gustav verheiratet? Wie heißt sie jetzt und wo wohnt sie? Sind Deine Kinder schon groß? Deine Frau war doch Lehrerin nicht wahr?

Wir leben hier als Flüchtlinge sehr schlecht und wir haben alles Hab und Gut verloren. Wir erhalten eine kleine Unterstützung, wohnen bei einem Bauern hier in einem Zimmer, schlafen und kochen darin. Wir haben hier in Westdeutschland über 2 000 000 Arbeitslose. Arbeit ist hier gar nicht zu bekommen also keinen Verdienst. Charly und Meta haben uns sehr geholfen, zumal wir kaum was anzuziehen hatten.

13 000 000 Flüchtlinge leben zur Zeit in der britischen und amerkanischen Zone. Die Polen weisen immer noch Deutsche aus, die hier gar nicht mehr unterzubringen sind. Hoffentlich kannst Du meine Schrift noch lesen.

Eine Bildaufnahme von meiner Familie lege ich bei. Charly hat uns ein Bild von Onkel Hermann geschickt. Vielleicht kannst Du uns von Euch auch mal Bilder schicken. Du kannst auch in englisch schreiben. Wir würden uns sehr freuen, von Euch bald mal zu hören.

Sebewaing, Michigan

Sebewaing, Michigan is located on Lake Huron on the east coast of Michigan in Huron County. "Sebewaing Village" was settled in 1835 and incorporated in 1879. The village was first spelled "Sibbewaing" - an Indian name for crooked creek.

What is now the state of Michigan was originally part of the Northwest Territory. A separate Michigan Territory was formed in 1805. The territory began to experience an influx of pioneer settlers after the War of 1812. The establishment of a steamship route from Buffalo, New York, to Detroit in 1818 and the completion of the Erie Canal in 1825 opened Michigan for settlers, including many who had emigrated from other countries. This area was especially attractive to German immigrants.

The first large group of inhabitants settled in the Sebewaing area around 1845 when Reverend John F. J. Auch, a Lutheran minister from Ann Arbor, Michigan brought a group here because of the good farmland that was available for a settlement. They also planned to do missionary work among the local Indians.

Huron County, Michigan census records indicate that its population increased from only 210 in 1850 to approximately 30,000 residents in 1900. The population increase was due largely to an influx of persons who were born in other countries. In fact, almost half of Huron County's residents in 1880 were born in a foreign country, predominantly Canada and Germany. There were also many immigrants from Poland, Ireland, England, Wales, and Scotland. It is interesting to note that Germans were the significant ethnic group that settled Sebewaing. Most of the German residents in Sebewaing were from German-speaking Prussia, primarily from its states of West Prussia, Posen, and Pomerania.

Like many others from Pommern, therefore, Herman Gall immigrated to America in 1880 and settled in Sebewaing, as did his brothers, Gustav in 1881, Robert in 1884, and Wilhelm - who made the journey with his wife Mathilde Roese Gall and their three small children, Mary, Bertha, and Fredrick - between 1883 and 1885.

Gustav Gall married Malvina Grassman in 1888. Her parents, Michael Grassman and Dorothea Sophia Christine Bolzmann Grassman, German immigrants, relocated to Sebewaing from New York State in 1871. In a 1952 article about Malvina's 85th birthday, she indicated that when she was four years old, her family moved to "the Sebewaing wilderness" to the farm that was occupied in 1952 by her sister and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Kunisch.

Wilhelm Gall

Wilhelm (William) Gall was born on the island of Wollin (possibly in Kölpin), Silesia in Pommern, on October 13, 1851. He was the oldest son of Karl Heinrich Gall (1822-1882) and Maria Rosina Kunisch Gall (1827-1869), who were married in the Evangelical Church in Kaiserswaldau on February 5, 1850. He had four siblings, Pauline Henriette (1850-1925), Herman (1856-1937), Carl Gustav Reinhold (1862-1940), and Robert (1866-1940). After his mother's death, his father remarried. All of the children from his father's second marriage died at an early age except for his half-sister Ottilia (1876-1932).

Wilhelm and his three brothers emigrated from Silesia to Michigan in the 1880s.

Wilhelm married Mathilde Roese (born September 22, 1849 in Silesia) around 1879. They immigrated to the U.S. and settled in Michigan between 1883 and 1885, together with several of their young children, Mary, Beatrice, and Fredrick. Mathilde's mother (a widow whose last name was Boethe) reportedly joined them the following year, and lived with them in Sebewaing.

According to the 1900 Michigan (Huron County, Township Sebewaing) census, Wilhelm and Mathilde had seven children, six of whom survived, Mary (or Maria, born June 1880), Beatrice (or Bertha, born August 1881), Fredrick (born September 1883), Albert (born October 1886), Martha (born October 1888), and Meta (born January 1891).

Wilhelm was listed as a fireman and a worker in a brick factory in the 1910 census.

Herman Karl Gall

Herman (Hermann) Karl Gall was born in Silesia (Prussia) on June 8, 1856. He was the son of Karl Heinrich Gall and Maria Rosina Kunisch Gall, who were married in 1850. Herman had five siblings, a sister Pauline Henriette (1850-1925), brothers Wilhelm (1851-1929), Carl Gustav Reinhold (1862-1940), and Robert (1866-1940), and a half sister Ottilie (1876-1932).. After his mother's death in 1869, his father remarried. Of the several children who were born from Karl Heinrich's second marriage, only his half-sister Ottilie lived to adulthood.

Herman and his three brothers emigrated from Pomerania to Michigan in the 1880s. Herman was the first to leave his homeland when he emigrated in 1880. His passport (Reise-Pass) - issued by the "Deutsches Reich - Königreich Preussen" - lists his name as "Hermann Gall" and indicates that was small in stature, had dark blond hair, blue eyes, and an oval face shape. After he arrived in America, he settled in Sebewaing (Huron County) and later Unionville (Tuscola County). He married Bertha Schmallenberg on November 21, 1881 in Bay City (Bay County), Michigan. Bertha was born in Germany on November 21, 1856.

Herman and Bertha had nine children, Mathilda (1882-1887), Edith Bertha Marie (1883-1966), Clara (1885-1966), Charles (1887-1960), Irene (1889-1969), Kurt (1891-1891), Elsa (1892-1976), Eric (1893-1961), and Alfred (1895-1964). Herman was a farmer who was involved in many community activities. His obituary in the Unionville Blade lists him as "Herman Gall, County Pioneer":

Herman Gall, County Pioneer, Dies Sunday

Mr. Herman Karl Gall, father of Village president Charley Gall, died early Sunday morning September 5 at 12:40 at his home on West State Street after a critical illness of more than six weeks confined to his bed. Mr. Gall was operated on at Mercy Hospital three times within a few days following an illness of 17 years.

Mr. Gall was born in Germany June 8, 1856, and was at the time of his death, 81 years, 2 months and 27 days old.

When he was 24 years old in 1880, he came to America and settled in Sebewaing. On November 21, 1881, he married Miss Bertha Schamelberg [sic] at Bay City and then located on his land which he had bought in this county, three miles east and ½ mile north of Unionville. Here their nine children were born, seven of whom survive.

He was bereft of his wife 20 year ago. Shortly afterward he retired from farming and moved to Sebewaing where he resided for a few years. He came to Unionville about 15 years ago.

He is survived by four daughters, Mrs. Fred Hofmeister and Mrs. Edward Kundinger, both of Sebewaing, and Mrs. Richard Weirauch and Mrs. Harry Steve, both of Saginaw, and three sons, Charley Gall of Unionville, Eric and Alfred Gall of Saginaw, and two brothers, Gustave Gall of Sebewaing and Robert Gall of Detroit, 19 grandchildren and seven great grandchildren, six nephews, and eight nieces and nephews in this locality.

Mr. Gall was a member of the Emmanuel Lutheran church, Sebewaing, where his funeral took place Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. List officiating. Burial in the Lutheran Cemetery. The pallbearers were six grandsons, Ralph Stave, Harry and Alfred Weirauch of Saginaw, Lawrence Hofmeister, Unionville, Herbert Hofmeister and Edward Kundinger of Sebewaing.

Mr. Gall was a quiet, industrious and inoffensive man all of his life, living almost entirely unto himself and family and church.

Herman remained in contact with his relatives in Germany and his extended family in Michigan for his entire life. He visited Marie Schreiber Schütt, daughter of his sister Pauline Henriette Ernestine Gall Schreiber, her husband Bernhard Schütt, and their family in 1911 in Dargebanz, on Wollin in Pomerania. Ellis Island records indicate that he arrived in the U.S. from his trip to Germany on April 17, 1911 on the President Grant (the ship departed from Hamburg, Germany). His granddaughter, Sherril Gall French, has a copy of a program from the Hamburg-America Line (Hamburg-Amerika Linie) ship on which he sailed.


Bertha died on November 21, 1920 in Unionville. Herman died in Unionville on September 5, 1937.



Carl Gustav Reinhold Gall

Carl Gustav Reinhold Gall was born in Silesia (possibly in Radischen, Reg. Bezirk Liegnitz), part of Prussia at the time, on July 9, 1862, the son of Karl Heinrich Gall (1822-1882) and Maria Rosina Kunisch Gall (1827-1869), who were married in the Evangelical Church in Kaiserswaldau on February 5, 1850. He was baptized at the Evangelical Church in Ober Hausdorf, Siliesia, Prussia on July 29, 1862.

Gustav had five siblings, a sister Pauline Henriette (1850-1925), three brothers Wilhelm (1851-1929), Herman (1856-1937), and Robert (1866-1940), and a younger half sister Ottilie (1876-1932). After his mother's death, his father remarried. Of the several children who were born from his father's second marriage, all died at an early age except for Gustav's half-sister Ottilie, who also immigrated to the USA and settled in Michigan. The family relocated from Silesia to Pomerania before September 24, 1876, when Gustav was confirmed at the Evangelical Church, Kölpin, Groß-Mokratz, Kreis Usedom, Pomerania.

Gustav, his three brothers, and their sister Ottilie emigrated from Pomerania to Michigan in the 1880s. According to an undated document written by Amanda Gall, his daughter, he applied for a passport to America on Dec 31, 1881 and left for America on May 2, 1882 from Neustettin. His age at the time 18 yrs 9 months. He became a naturalized U.S. citizen in 1902, according to the 1920 Michigan census), settled in Sebewaing in Huron County, where he met and married Malvina Marie Elisabeth Grassman (Grassmann) on February 23, 1888. Malvina was born in Niagara County, New York on August 22, 1867.

Gustav and Malvina owned a farm and had four children, Emma Bertha Maria (1888-1975), Amanda Rosina (1889-1981), Ernest Gustav (1892-1951), and Helena Libby Ernstine (1894-1986). They adopted a fifth child Ferdinand Marten, who was born on March 1, 1905.

Gustav was listed as a house builder, carpenter, landowner, and farmer in several Michigan census references. He and Malvina remained in close contact with their extended family, including many relatives who had immigrated from Germany, for their entire lives. Gustav died in Sebewaing on July 22, 1940. He was interred at Silverlawn Cemetery in Sebewaing. The inscription on his headstone is: "Gustav R. Gall, Father, Emmanuel Luth. Church - 1 John 4, 14 - July 9, 1862 - July 22, 1940"; this verse is: "... whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall become in him a well of water springing up unto eternal life." Malvina died on June 23, 1959, at the age of 91. She is also buried at Silverlawn Cemetery, beside her husband in the Grassmann-Gall section of the cemetery.

Malvina Grassman Gall and her Family

Malvina Grassman was born in Niagara County, New York on August 22, 1867. Her parents, Michael Grassman and Dorothea Sophia Christine Bolzmann, were born in Germany. The 1880 Michigan census (Huron County, Sebewaing Township) indicated that Michael Grassman was born in Prussia and that Dorothea was born in Mecklenburg.

Michael immigrated to the Buffalo, New York area in 1857 from Prenzlau, Mecklenburg with his first wife, Friedericke Witte. After Friedericke's death, he married Dorothea Bolzmann, who had immigrated to New York from Sukow, a small town in the Mecklenburg-Schwerin area of Vorpommern.

Is it possible that Michael and Dorothea immigrated to this particular area to join the community of "Old Lutherans" from Prussia and Mecklenburg who began immigrating here in 1839? These devout "Old Lutheran" immigrants objected to the merger of the Lutheran Church and the Calvinist Reformed Church in 1817 and chose to leave their homeland rather than comply with the state-mandated unified church. Many immigrated to areas in the United States that were similar to the Baltic lands, such as Buffalo, New York, and Milwaukee, Wisconsin. These areas had the same glacial geography that existed in the Baltic areas of Prussia. These immigrants established German-speaking areas where many Germans settled.

Many people emigrated from Mecklenburg/Schwerin, the area of Germany where Dorothea was born during the 19th century. Mecklenburg had the third highest emigration rate in Europe after 1850, superseded only by Ireland and Galicia, the European area where Poland and Ukraine are currently located. Many people, especially those from the lower social classes and rural areas, had very limited prospects in Mecklenburg after the transition from feudal rule to civil-capitalist rule. Approximately 146,000 people from Mecklenburg emigrated abroad between 1850 and 1890. Most of the emigrants went to the United States, but some of the emigrants went to South America, South Africa, Canada, and Australia. There was another surge in emigration after the defeat of the civil-democratic revolution in 1848-1849, with resulting inhumane social and political conditions. Persons who had not been granted the right of establishment could not marry, establish a home, or have a family. Paid laborers who were refused the right of establishment by the ruling class for their entire lives were given only a limited right to residence for as long as they had work. These conditions led to a large increase in emigration.

Michael's daughter Bertha (Berda) from his first marriage was born on April 3, 1860 in New York, and accompanied Michael, Dorothea, and their small children Mary, Malvina, Johann, and Ida to Sebewaing, Michigan in 1871. An article about Malvina Grassman Gall's 85th birthday in the local newspaper, The Sebewaing Blade ("Still Spry and Active," 1952), indicated that, when Malvina was four years old, her family moved to what she termed "the Sebewaing wilderness," to the farm that was occupied in 1952 by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Kunisch [her sister]." After the Grassman family moved to Michigan, they had three more children, Ernst, Herman, and Gustav.

Although Malvina was born in the United States, she usually spoke German at home. Her English was quite limited. She enjoyed the company of family and friends, with whom she often shared the wine that she made. She was an avid gardener. She died on June 23, 1959, at the age of 91.



Amanda Rosina Gall

Amanda Rosina Gall was born on July 30, 1889 in Sebewaing (Huron County), Michigan, the daughter of Gustav Reinhold Gall (July 9, 1862 - July 22, 1940) and Malvina Grassman Gall (August 22, 1867 - June 24, 1959). She had two sisters, Emma Bertha Maria (1888-1975) and Helena Libby Ernstine (1894-1986), and a brother Ernest Gustav (1892-1950). Her parents also raised a foster child Ferdinand Marten, who was born around 1906.

Amanda and her siblings were forced to leave school after the fourth grade in order to help their parents farm the land. She always regretted having to leave school early. She had an extremely inquisitive mind and read voraciously all of her life.

She (and possibly her older sister Emma, who married and lived in Chicago) left home and moved to Chicago (Cook County), Illinois when she was approximately 17 years old. She sent a postcard to her parents in 1909 with an image of the house where she lived (inscribed on the front by her: "Das ist unser Haus," which means "That is our house"). The postcard (*image below*) -- addressed to Mr. and Mrs. Gustav Gall, Rt. #3, No. 89; Sebewaing, Huron County, Michigan -- was postmarked April 26, 1909. Amanda subsequently moved to Denver (Denver County), Colorado, where she met and married John Allen Beeler.

Amanda met John Allen Beeler when she worked in Denver. They were married on July 17, 1913 in Chicago, Illinois. An article from the *Denver Tramway Bulletin* (September 1913, page 9) entitled "General Manager Beeler Returns with a Bride" included the following excerpt:

A very quiet and unostentatious wedding occurred in Chicago on July 17th last, at the parsonage of the St. James Evangelical Lutheran church, when Miss Rose A. Gall, of Sebewaing, Michigan, and Mr. John A. Beeler, vice president and general manager of the Denver City Tramway Company, were united in marriage by the Reverend Karl Schmidt.

Immediately following the ceremony Mr. and Mrs. Beeler left on the Limited for New Orleans, escaping all rice, old shoes and satin ribbon decorations, thus not only saving solicitous friends much trouble and expense, but conserving the rice crop.

From New Orleans they sailed for Panama, where the great canal joining the Atlantic to the Pacific is fast nearing completion. After an inspection of the canal workings, they proceeded to Port Limon, thence by rail over the Coderilla Mountains to San Jose, Costa Rica...Almirante, Panama, was visited, and the world's largest banana plantations inspected.

Mrs. Beeler is a good sailor, and says she was not seasick for even a moment. Mr. Beeler says he would not take an ocean voyage if he could not be seasick--that that is one of the most important features.

Mr. and Mrs. Beeler will be at home to their friends at 2030 Fairfax Street after September 30th.

John Allen Beeler was a prominent engineer and consultant in transit modernization plans in large cities throughout the country. He was the general manager of the Denver Tram Company when they married, and subsequently became the president of the Beeler Organization, Inc., Consultant Engineers, in New York City.

After their marriage, Amanda and John lived at 2030 Fairfax Street in Denver, Colorado, near his parents. The children from his first marriage, Horace (1896-1924) and Dorothy Beeler (1900-1976), lived with them.

Amanda and John had three daughters, Betty Malvina (October 22, 1916 - October 13, 1991), Esther Lois (April 29, 1919 - February 5, 1997), and Rosemary Virginia (March 8, 1921 -). Although they lived in several cities in different states, they visited their Gall relatives in Michigan frequently.

Betty and her parents moved to New York City, where John established the Beeler Organization, Inc., Consultant Engineers when she was a baby, subsequently to Hartsdale (Westchester) and later to Scarsdale (Westchester), New York, where Betty and her sisters grew up. They were one of the first

families to move into Scarsdale.

Amanda wrote the following passage in Betty's baby book on July 16, 1920:

At last we have left NY City and are living in a real home. How my babies will enjoy the freedom of outdoors. Our three years in NY City seemed like thirty to mother, all cooped in a large building and seeing only other such buildings when looking out of windows. Now we have the freedom of sunshine and fresh air.

Their daughters attended Knox Boarding School in Cooperstown (Otsego County), New York and graduated from Scarsdale High School. Amanda and John were devoted to their three daughters. John's philosophy about raising responsible children was evident in a letter that he sent Amanda (he called her "Rose") as they planned to send Betty and Esther on a Caribbean cruise:

Dear Rose,

I agree with you. Parents should make confidents of their children and rule by reason and not by fear and dogmatism.

The trip will be wonderfully educational. One that they will never forget. It will give them confidence in themselves and a better understanding of others. I am enclosing a check covering fares for both 2 X \$129.50 = \$259.00 plus \$100.00 for Esther's expenses making it \$350 in round figures. I want them to have a good time and learn to handle their own money.

I spoke to Betty over the phone today about taking up the tickets and getting Travelers checks. Must quit & get this in the mail.

Sincerely, J. A.

John's business in New York City was quite successful. He took his son-in-law, Samuel Long, in as his business partner. His family was devastated when John died unexpectedly on July 11, 1945. The New York *Herald Tribune* published the following obituary on July 12, 1945:

John A. Beeler, 78, president of the Beeler Organization, consultant engineers, and for many years a consultant on transit problems in large cities throughout the country, was killed yesterday afternoon when he fell from a window of his twenty-second-floor office at 155 East Forty-fourth Street to the roof of a seventh-floor extension.

Samuel Long, his son-in-law, of 32 Farley Road, Scarsdale, N.Y., told police...that Mr. Beeler had stepped to the window for a breath of air, became dizzy and fell. He lived at 105 Garth Road, Scarsdale.

Mr. Beeler attended public schools and early became interested in municipal transit problems. He was an assistant engineer in the construction of the cable railways of Cincinnati and Denver from 1885 to 1890, and the chief engineer of the Denver Tramway Company from 1890 to 1902. He became vice-president and manager of the same company in 1902 and remained with it until 1915, when he established his own consultant practice.

Since 1915 he has acted as a consultant engineer on transit and other public utility problems in New York, Boston, Washington, Kansas City, New Orleans, Dallas, and other cities.

He also served, from 1902 to 1915, as vice-president and general superintendent of the D. and N.W. Railway Company, and from 1903 to 1915 as director in charge of operations of the Denver and Intermountain Railroad Company. In New York he later was a consulting traffic expert for the New York Transit Commission.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Amanda Rosini Gall Beeler, and four daughters, Mrs. Dorothy D. Long, of Scarsdale, Mrs. Rosemary Knight, of Cleveland, Mrs. Betty Johnson and Mrs. Esther Evangelist, both of White Plains, N.Y.

After John's death, Amanda moved to Fairview Park (Cuyahoga County), Ohio, a suburb of Cleveland, where she lived with her daughter Rosemary and her husband, Chase Knight. She moved to Lake Placid (Highlands County), Florida circa 1960, and subsequently to Wilton Manors (Broward County), Florida to live near her daughter Rosemary circa 1971. She died of heart failure at her Wilton Manors home on July 17, 1981.

Robert Gall

Robert Gall was born in Silesia on September 18, 1866. He was the youngest son of Karl Heinrich Gall (1822-1882) and Maria Rosina Kunisch Gall (1827-1869). Robert had four siblings, Pauline Henriette (1850-1925), Wilhelm (1851-1929), Herman (1856-1937), and Carl Gustav Reinhold (1862-1940). After his mother's death in 1869, his father remarried. Of the several children who were born from Karl Heinrich's second marriage, all died at a young age except for his half-sister Ottilie (1876-1932).

Robert, his three brothers and younger half sister emigrated from Pomerania to Michigan in the 1880s. The 1900 census indicated that Robert immigrated to the U.S. in 1884.

Robert married Lena Neuman (born in Michigan on June 25, 1874) circa 1897. According to the 1900 and 1910 Michigan census (Huron County, Township Sebewaing), Robert and Lena had three daughters, Alma, who was born in May 1898, Mildred, born circa 1903, and Agnes, born circa 1905. His occupation was listed as house builder (1900) and farmer (truck farm 1910).

Ottilie Gall Weirauch (1876-1928)

After Maria Rosina's death in 1869 Karl Heinrich remarried (the name of his second spouse is unknown).

Although several children were evidently born during his second marriage, only one child - Ottilie (Ottilia) Gall (born on November 10, 1876) survived until adulthood.

Like her older half-brothers, Ottilie immigrated to Michigan in 1883 from Germany. She immigrated as a child with her older half-brother Wilhelm Gall and his family after their father, Karl Heinrich Gall, died on February 2, 1882 in Pomerania.
